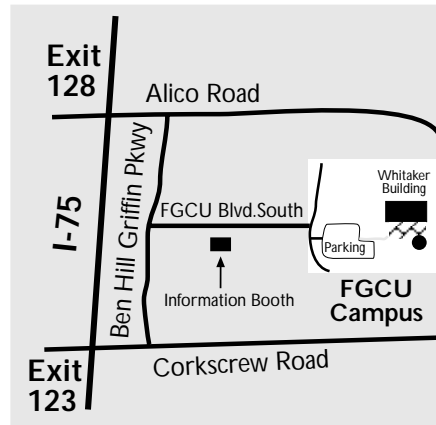




Registration and Check in is from 8 – 9am
